As well as a diverse range of 200 stall holders, new initiatives for 2018 range from Jericho Coffee Traders providing tea and coffee at the entrance in a festive LPM Bohemia Yurt, an art gallery exhibiting the artists Natasha Kumar and Paul Vanstone, plus a (free!) range of cooking demonstrations in the Heaven & Stubbs kitchen, which includes James Hearfield, head of the Daylesford Cookery School, and Mark Stinchcombe, winner of MasterChef: The Professionals and co-head chef at Eckington Manor with his wife Sue Stinchcombe. Tesla, one of the leading electric car brands, will also be on site with demonstration vehicles. ♦
